Reese H. Clark, MD is a leading clinical researcher for the care of critically-ill newborns. He joined Pediatrix Medical Group as the Director of Neonatal Research in 1998 and was appointed Vice President and Co-Director of The Center for Research, Education and Quality in September 2012. He also serves as a consulting associate professor at Duke University in Durham, North Carolina.

From 1990 through 1997, Dr. Clark served as the Co-Director of the Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation (ECMO) Program at Atlanta's Emory University School of Medicine. He has published over 100 original articles, authored five chapters in neonatal texts, and presented his work at over 100 national and international conferences.

Dr. Clark's success as a leader in clinical research has long been recognized by his peers in the medical community. In 1995, he was appointed by the FDA to serve as an advisor to the Anesthesiology and Respiratory Therapy Devices Panel of the Medical Devices Committee. He has directed numerous clinical studies which have helped lead to FDA approval of new drugs and devices designed to save babies' lives.

Dr. Clark, board certified in pediatrics and neonatal medicine, earned his medical degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He completed his pediatric residency and neonatal-perinatal medicine fellowship at the United States Air Force clinic, Wilford Hall Medical Center, in San Antonio, Texas.
